KIAC'S MISSION

Recognizing the inherent worth and dignity of all people, KIAC works for the well-being and empowerment of immigrants through education, advocacy and social justice.

KIAC envisions a community where everyone, regardless of where they were born, has fair and equitable access to justice, respect and opportunity.

2022 IMPACT STORY

At just 9 years old, Elizabeth and her family immigrated to the U.S. from Mexico, seeking asylum in California. As an adult, Elizabeth moved to Washington where she applied to become a U.S. Citizen. While the application seemed straightforward, Elizabeth grew concerned when she didn't get a response from USCIS for over a year after applying on her own. She reached out to KIAC for help.

Elizabeth spoke with DOJ Accredited Representative Ray who scheduled her for an intake interview and took on her case. Ray inquired about Elizabeth's application and discovered that one of the fees had not been paid, putting her application on hold. Elizabeth paid the missing fee and awaited a response.

In the meantime, Elizabeth began volunteering as an interpreter for KIAC's weekly medical clinics.

Late in 2016, KIAC's Board of Directors approved a part-time paid administrative assistant position. Enjoying her time at KIAC, and eager to get more involved, Elizabeth applied for the role and was offered the job, becoming a KIAC staff member!

Meanwhile, Elizabeth's application for citizenship made its way through the system. On April 10, 2017, Elizabeth became a naturalized United States citizen!



While personal circumstances later forced Elizabeth to leave KIAC's part-time position for full-time employment elsewhere, she stayed involved as a volunteer. Last January, Elizabeth was approached about joining the Board of Directors. With encouragement and guidance from Ray, Elizabeth submitted her application. In early 2022, Elizabeth became a KIAC Board Member.

This past November, Ray approached Elizabeth, encouraging her to consider becoming the KIAC Board President. After deliberating all the position entails, Elizabeth submitted her name for consideration and was voted into the President role in January 2023. Elizabeth currently works as Public Records Manager at Olympic College and lives in Bremerton with her husband Ron and their two dogs Coco Bean and Roxy.

KIAC has played a significant role in Elizabeth's life, and now as Board President, Elizabeth is investing her time, talent and resources to lead KIAC into the next phase of our journey. Elizabeth's story exemplifies perseverance, the power of community and the impact KIAC makes in the lives of the thousands of clients we serve each year.

KIAC BY THE NUMBERS


